

since April 2014, the Fédération québécoise des professeures et professeurs d'université (FQPPU) has held a series of forums aimed at identifying issues associated with academic life and the professorial workload. Two such events, which were focused on teaching and service, respectively, have already taken place. The subject of the third forum is research.

The dynamic and diverse research carried out in Quebec universities contributes to the socioeconomic development of communities, sheds light on public policy, and enriches theoretical and applied knowledge that will allow society to respond to future challenges.

However, in Quebec, the research community is currently undergoing upheaval (new policies, budget cuts in some sectors, increased directed funding, etc.) that compromises the activities of those on the front line: professors. The goal of this forum is to take stock of current trends and future prospects with regards to funding, research conditions, and dissemination of research results.

Guest speakers from the academic community, as well as institutional representatives, have been invited to take the floor and identify courses of action that would allow research to be carried out in Quebec under optimal conditions.
